**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
OF THE CAMBRIA COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT
ADOPTING THE UPDATED AND REVISED
2005 URBAN WATER MANAGEMENT PLAN**

WHEREAS, the California Legislature enacted Assembly Bill 797 (Water Code Section 10610 et seq., known as the Urban Water Management Planning Act) during the 1983-1984 Regular Session, and as amended subsequently, which mandates that every supplier providing water for municipal purposes to more than 3,000 customers or supplying more than 3,000 acre-feet of water annually, prepare an Urban Water Management Plan, the primary objective of which is to plan for the conservation and efficient use of water, and

WHEREAS, the District is an urban supplier of water providing water to a population over 6,400, and

WHEREAS, the Plan shall be periodically reviewed at least once every five years, and that the District shall make any amendments or changes to its Plan which are indicated by the review; and

WHEREAS, the District prepared and circulated for public review a draft 2005 Urban Water Management Plan, and a properly noticed public hearing regarding said Plan was held by the District on March 15, 2005; and

WHEREAS, the District did prepare and shall file said Plan with the California Department of Water Resources by March 24, 2005; and

WHEREAS, the District subsequently revised said Plan in response to review comments received from the California Department of Water Resources; and

WHEREAS, the District prepared and circulated for public review a revised December 2005 Urban Water Management Plan, and a properly noticed public hearing regarding said Plan was held by the District on December 15, 2005.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Cambria Community Services District as follows:

1. The December 2005 Urban Water Management Plan is hereby adopted and ordered filed with the District Clerk; The General Manager is hereby authorized and directed to file the December 2005 Urban Water Management Plan with the California Department of Water Resources within 30 days after this date.
2. The General Manager is hereby authorized and directed to implement the Water Conservation Programs as set forth in the December 2005 Urban Water Management Plan, which includes water shortage contingency analysis and recommendations to the District regarding necessary procedures, rules, and regulations to carry out effective and equitable water conservation and water recycling programs.


