- dogs that run hard are injured

- small dogs have difficulty navigating the large heavy wood

It's our understanding that the chipper maybe calibrated to cut small pieces.

Yes it takes more time to produce , but the end result will help reduce injury (vet bills)

| Written Public Comment: | <p>I sincerely hope the Board considers as it's first, highest priority for developing East Ranch Community Park will be paving the Rodeo Grounds access road. Whether or not Rodeo Grounds Road is CSD responsibility or County responsibility, the paving of this road should be done before any further development is done. During dry season, Rodeo Grounds Road is a rough, rutted dust bowl. During rainy season it's a rough, rutted mudhole. The road drains into Santa Rosa Creek, silting it up, likely blocking any salmon migration. (and violating any number of illegal discharge statutes) The mud that doesn't make it into the creek gets spread over Burton Drive, making that end of town an eyesore. Once it dries, clouds of dust get kicked up covering everything on that end of town. Please, make it Priority Number One for development of this area!</p> |
