This is a major change in the district's approach to the EWS/SWF/WRF, from providing water for new connections, back to its original purpose, providing water to existing customers only. The staff report summarizes the project's history since the County Emergency Permit was issued in 2014.

The proposed changes to the project description are likely to move completion of the Coastal Development Permit application forward.

The project description has been extensively discussed in the past. The district hired Paavo Ogren as a strategic advisor on exactly this issue in 2019. He advised in favor of this limited use project description at the November 21, 2019 meeting, https://slospan.org/meeting/ccsd 20191121/, and against the more expansive description.

At that meeting, the board requested the staff bring the project description for existing users only to the board. Nevertheless, staff brought back the project description for growth at the June 25, 2020 Special Meeting, https://slo-span.org/meeting/ccsd_20191121/.

Many members of the public participated in the discussion at that meeting. Despite the importance of this decision, the board determined that it did not need to take action on it, and directed staff to proceed, with the project description for growth it had previously rejected.

Since 2020, the board and staff have insisted on the description that adds new users, despite all advice and discussion.

The staff report poses this as a first Phase, to allow the project to get a permit and be operated, to collect data for future expansion. Be that as it may, it moves the project application forward, making it more likely the district will be able to complete the three-year-old County CDP application. Last week, the board accepted Mr. Dienzo's evaluation that the permit application may be completed in the third quarter of this year.

What it will take for the Coastal Commission to approve such a permit is another question. Recently, Tom Luster, senior environmental scientist with the Coastal Commission, commented on the "location of project components in sensitive habitat - underpinning our evaluation is the ongoing and unresolved nonconformity of having project elements (and

former project elements, such as the evaporation basin) located within ESHA. We are about to get to Year 9 of the project being located in sensitive habitat without mitigation and without a determination about feasible alternative locations."

Changing the project description does not address that and other concerns, but it does remove the most significant obstacle to completing the CDP application and moving the process forward at the county level.

Phase II is dealing with the brine waste. That issue remains to be resolved.

Please adopt this revision to the project description.



• We support the staff recommendation for a phased WRF permit application as described in today's agenda package.

- WRF operating experience is necessary to verify safe, sustainable pumping rates at the 9P7 WRF supply well. The current WRF project description specifies a pumping rate of 581 gallons per minute at the 9P7 well. This pumping rate is approximately double the rate of percolation pond recharge from the wastewater treatment plant and is not sustainable.
- WRF operating experience is necessary to demonstrate that the District can supply water to its existing customers and water to comply with the Warren Ranch Settlement Agreement. This agreement was drafted long before the WRF was installed and additional coordination between Warren Ranch well 9P4 and CCSD well 9P7 operation may be required to avoid adverse impacts to the water supply.
- The current WRF project description requires trucking the brine waste from the WRF facility to an offsite licensed disposal company. Due to the prohibitive cost of trucking and disposal, operation of the WRF must be kept to a minimum until a viable method of disposing of the brine waste becomes available.
- The proposed phased permit application will expedite approval for operation of the WRF for existing customers to avoid water shortage emergencies, and will provide the operating experience necessary to expand the permit to allow additional connections in the future.

President Dean and members of the Board:

I am writing to support the modification of the project description for the Water Reclamation Facility Coastal Development Permit application to remove growth-inducing impacts, and seek to permit the facility to provide drought protection for existing users. That's how the project was originally sold to Cambria's ratepayers back in 2014, and that's what it was designed to provide. Efforts to permit the facility to support additional water connections have gone nowhere. Nine years and millions of wasted ratepayer's dollars later, CCSD has been unable to complete even an application for a "regular" Coastal Development required by the County to operate the facility in the absence of a declared drought emergency.

While this proposed modification of the permit application may not move the needle in securing an regular operating permit even for drought protection for existing users, at this point it can't hurt. CCSD has dug itself and the community of Cambria a big and very expensive hole with this ill-conceived and badly executed project. It's time to stop digging.
